House Prices

Introduction

The following analysis describes development in the price of houses to buy and the price of accommodation to rent within the parish of Odd Rode from January 2010 to December 2011. The information is drawn from a sample of properties that have been advertised for sale or to rent. Properties included in the analysis have of necessity been limited in number. The reader should therefore be cautious in drawing conclusions from the results of the analysis.

The trends described for properties that have been advertised for sale or to rent within Odd Rode are largely similar to trends for wider areas.

Houses for Sale

It is seen from the graph below that the average price of houses advertised for sale over the past two years reached a low point at the end of 2010 (\pm 192,043), but has since recovered.



The annual average advertised price for 2011 was $\pounds 238,943$ an increase of 24.6% fom $\pounds 191,743$ in 2010.

The most expensive house advertised during 2011 was a Victorian detached 4 bedroom house in Scholar Green at \pounds 565,000. The least expensive house advertised for sale was a Victorian semi detached 3 bedroom also in Scholar Green at \pounds 90,000.

It is seen from the above table that in 2010 the most expensive houses were advertised for sale in Rode Heath. In 2011 the most expensive houses were advertised for sale in Mow Cop and Scholar Green.

Note: Some types of houses that only appeared in single numbers are not included in this table.

Although not every type of residential accommodation is included in table 2 above it is clear that changes in the advertised price for detached houses and bungalows have been important in setting the overall increase in house price in the parish.

Accommodation to Rent

The average advertised monthly charge for rented accommodation within Odd Rode increased from £550 per calendar month (pcm) in 2010 to £586 in 2011, an increase of 6.6%.

The most expensive property in this regard in 2011 was a maturing detached 2 bedroom house advertised for rent in Rode Heath at £650 pcm. The least expensive property was a Victorian detached 2 bedroom house advertised in Mow Cop at £550 pcm.

The most expensive area within which to rent property has been Rode Heath at an average of $\pounds 615$ pcm while Scholar Green has been less expensive at an average of $\pounds 563$ pcm. Flats were advertised for rent in Mount Pleasant at $\pounds 550$ pcm.

Detached houses were advertised for rent at an average of $\pounds 608$ pcm, semidetached at an average of $\pounds 570$, while a terraced house were advertised at $\pounds 480$.
